CHECKLIST FOR SURGERY

Before surgery

- All forms required for surgery must be signed and returned at least 24 hours prior to surgery. (Estimate, Authorization for surgery, credit card authorization/payment, and checklist for surgery)
- No food after midnight (Water is OK-in moderation).
- If your pet needs to take medications the morning of surgery, please call Sirius Vet, at least 1 day in advance, to make sure the medication will not counteract with any treatments planned for your pet.
- Bathe or groom your pet prior to surgery, as there is not bathing for 8 weeks, postsurgery.
- We will call to confirm your surgical appointment 24-48 hours prior to the appointment.
 At this time we will review forms and will collect the deposit for surgery.

Day of surgery

- Patient <u>drop-off</u> will be between 7:00-8:00am.(The surgical order is determined by the doctor, after all patients are checked in.)
- · Please call when you arrive.
- Please make a list of all of your pet's current <u>medications</u>, <u>dosages</u>, <u>and quantities</u>.
 Bring 1-2 feedings of your pet's <u>special diet (no raw food)</u>, and/or <u>e-collar(plastic cone)</u> with you. If you do not bring an e-collar with you, we will make sure your pet goes home with one (cost \$10-30 depending on size and material).
- The low end of the estimate will be collected as a **deposit** the morning of surgery.
- · We will schedule a pick-up appointment with you.
- You will be asked to mark your pet's limb that is to be operated on, with a marker we
 will provide to you.
- We perform **surgeries from 9am 5pm**; you will be contacted as soon as we are finished.
- Patient will be hospitalized overnight for post-operative care. *Time allowing, our nurse will send you a text(mobile numbers only) update between 8pm-10pm.

Day following surgery

- <u>Discharge</u> will typically take 20-30 minutes.
 - → Discharge will consist of <u>final payment</u>, scheduling <u>recheck appointments</u>, and going over discharge instructions.
 - ◆ We will discuss medications, give you some exercises to do at home, review and answer any additional questions.
- Please park on the Eastside of the building. (by the door framed by two trees.)
- It is not uncommon for your pet to be a little **sleepy** or **wobbly** when they go home.
- There may be a bandage over the <u>IV catheter</u> site. This can be removed when you get home.

Evening following surgery

- Start by **feeding** 1/4 to 1/2 of a normal meal. Many patients do not have a big appetite following surgery. Allow them a few days to regain their normal appetite.
- Feel free to <u>call</u> or <u>text</u> the clinic with any non-urgent questions. We will try to contact
 you within 24 hours. Calls received on the weekend will not be answered until Monday
 afternoon. If you have an <u>emergency</u> please do not wait for a call back and head to
 the closest emergency veterinary clinic.
